- 6. How many s166 Skilled Persons reviews of e-money firms did the FCA commission in 2021, 2022 and 2023, respectively, in relation to weaknesses in firms' financial crime systems and controls?
- 7. How many e-money firms did the FCA subject to business restrictions in 2021, 2022 and 2023, respectively, in relation to weaknesses in firms' financial crime systems and controls?
- 8. How many e-money firms are currently subject to s166 reviews in relation to breaches of the Money Laundering Regulations and/or other weaknesses in their financial crime systems and controls?
- 9. How many e-money firms are currently subject to business restrictions in relation to breaches of the Money Laundering Regulations and/or other weaknesses in their financial crime systems and controls?'
